Saints' Days

Julian of Norwich

Julian was a 15th century religious hermit of whom, little is known about her life apart from her writings. Julian lived in a time of turmoil but her beliefs remained optimistic and her writings spoke of God's love in terms of joy and compassion, as opposed to law and duty as was common in her day. Her writings have greatly influenced the feminist theology of the 20th century. Julian of Norwich is commemorated on May 8th.

Holy Days

Rogation Sunday

The Sunday before Ascension Thursday is known as Rogation Sunday. Traditionally, this was a service involving prayers for the harvest and the blessing of the crops. The three days that follow are known as Rogation Days and in the past they were observed by fasting in preparation for the celebration of the Ascension. This year, Rogation Sunday falls on May 5th.

The Feast of the Ascension

Ascension Day celebrates the bodily ascension of Jesus where He was taken up into heaven in the presence of the remaining Apostles forty days after the Resurrection. The Ascension is professed in the Nicene and Apostles Creeds. It is the last of the five (5) major milestones in the gospel narrative of Jesus' life, the others being the Baptism, the Transfiguration, the Crucifixion and the Resurrection. The Feast of the Ascension, which is celebrated on May 9th this year, is one of the ecumenical, i.e. universally celebrated, feasts of the Christian church.

Words of Wisdom

Before you judge

Let not your heart be guided by the rumours that you hear but give, the victim every chance to prove he is sincere. Let not your mind be poisoned by the darts some people throw. Investigate and try to find the facts you ought to know. It is so easy to condemn, and play a dirty game, to manufacture lies and to besmirch a good and worthy name.

Stewardship in Action

Anna lived in a dysfunctional household where there was always conflict. Despite this she was a friendly child who responded well to persons who reached out to her. When Sarah realised that Anna needed to be taught about God, she knew it would be a challenge to do so without angering her parents.

Sarah started by dropping the occasional word when the infant was walking with her parents. Eventually Anna started pointing at Sarah's house until her parents allowed her to visit. Sarah made good use of these visits by teaching her about Jesus and how to pray.

Unfortunately there was a long break in the visits. When Sarah had given up hope thinking her work had gone in vain, she saw Anna waving to her enthusiastically one evening." I was looking for you to tell you I prayed for you at school" she said as she repeated the pray.

Sarah was so overwhelmed with emotion she could only whisper "thank you" before going inside to thank God.

Remember even while on the cross Jesus reached out to the thieves.

As stewards, have you done your part in reaching out?

This Easter season as we reflect on the Journey, I know that many of us can relate to this story which was shared by one of our sisters in the congregation.
