Holy Days

The Day of Pentecost: Also known as Whit Sunday, the Day of Pentecost is celebrated seven weeks (50 days) after the Sunday of the Resurrection, hence its name. Pentecost commemorates the gift of the Holy Spirit which empowered the followers of Christ then and now to go out into the world and be witnesses for Christ. Pentecost is sometimes described by some Christians as the Birthday of the Church.

Saints' Days

Bede the Venerable: Remembered on May 25th, Bede was an English priest and monk in the 7th century. Bede was a skilled linguist and translator and his work with the Latin and Greek writings of the early Church Fathers contributed greatly to English Christianity.

Colour of the Day

If you look around the church, you will notice that the colour for the Feast of Pentecost is Red. Red signifies tongues of fire that came to rest on the heads of the Apostles and the other followers of Christ as the Holy Spirit descended upon them. Look around the church, at the Altar frontal, the Priests and the Eucharistic Minister's vestments and the choir scarfs. They are all Red.

Stewardship—A Way Of Life

We often hear persons expressing this thought in these or similar words “My power and the strength of my hands have produced this wealth for me” This issue is not restricted to our era. From way back in time, Moses in Deuteronomy 8, vs. 17 & 18 when reacting to some concerns had to advise the Israelites “So then you must never think that you have made yourselves wealthy by your own power and strength. Remember that it is the Lord who gives you the power to become rich.”

We must always remember that there are two parties in the relationship governing our stewardship obligations: God, who gives us and will one day ask us to account for our stewardship, and we, the receivers, who must manage and one day will have to account for the use of his resources.

Since we bring nothing to the table, whatever is on it comes from God. He alone has the right to endow us with gifts as he sees fit. Some persons have an abundance of resources and some have little. There is no doubt that the current economic recession has caused hardship on many persons. This is the time that those who have, can use this opportunity to assist the less fortunate.

How about sponsoring the child who is changing schools and has many associated expenses?

Remember the family with four or more children who are all at different stages of education and all need supplies?

Can you assist your neighbour still reeling from the losses incurred when he lost the family business?

Is there someone who has been made redundant but feels, ashamed to ask for help? God has blessed us with many resources and abilities. Be tactful, sensitive and considerate as we use them to further his kingdom.
