Colours of the Season:

If you look around the church, you will notice that the colour for the season of Pentecost is Green. Green signifies the triumph of life over death. Martyrs of Uganda: On June 4th, we remember the Christian converts who were martyred for their faith in the historical kingdom of Buganda, modern day Uganda, between 1885 and 1887.

Boniface, Archbishop and Martyr: Known as the Apostle to the Germans, Boniface was a missionary who spread Christianity in the Frankish Empire during the 8th century. He was killed in Frisia in 754AD along with 52 other souls. Boniface is commemorated on June 5th.
