The Barbados Blossom Award is the highest award a Blossom can receive in Girl Guiding before she blooms up to Brownies.

This award must be received before the Blossom's eighth birthday.

The Blossom must earn six compulsory badges namely – Sleep Over, Fun Day, Activity, Craft, Environment and Performance.

The Blossom must visit a Heritage Site, write an essay two paragraphs long and make a collage or poster about her visit.

The Blossom must also complete a Community Service with a visit to a Children's Nursery, Children's Home or Elderly Care Home and entertain the residents.

She must write an essay two paragraphs long and make a collage or poster about her visit.

The information is forwarded to a tester. The Blossom is tested and if successful is awarded the Barbados Blossom Award – A Certificate and a Badge.

The Barbados Brownie Award is the highest award a Brownie can receive in Girl Guiding. This award must be achieved before the Brownie reaches her twelfth birthday.

The Brownie must work for and earn twelve compulsory badges namely :- Crime Prevention, Home Safety, Thrift,

First Aider, Conservation, Advanced Pack Holiday, Needle Worker, World Guiding, Cooks, Road Safety, Fire Safety and Home Skills. The Brownie must also receive eight other interest badges from the following categories: – Fitness, Arts/

Craft, World Friendship and Miscellaneous.

The Brownie must also receive the Highway Badge which involves the eight points of the Brownie programme: – Brownies Do Their Best, Brownies Are Wide Awake, Brownies Keep Healthy, Brownies Make Things, Brownies Are Friendly, Brownies Lend A Hand, Brownies Are Helpful At Home and Brownies Have Fun Out of Doors.

The Brownie must research and prepare a scrap book on Barbados which includes history, geography, national emblems, two famous Barbadians, five Industries, six places of interest, eight sports, five

crops, five fruits and two Barbadian recipes.

The Brownie must also collect and mount a display on stamps, coins, seeds, shells etc.

The completed booklet is forwarded to the Badge Secretary and a team of Testers who will test the Brownie on all aspects of the scrap book.

If the Brownie is successful, she is awarded a certificate and a special badge at an Awards Ceremony in recognition of her achievement.

Saints' Days

Irenaeus, Bishop of Lyon: He was one of the early Church fathers whose writings were formative in the development of Christian theology. Irenaeus emphasized the traditional elements of the Church and is remembered on June 28th.

Saints Peter & Paul, Apostles: On June 29th the Church celebrates the feast day of St. Peter and St. Paul. They are undoubtedly two of the most important figures in the Church after Christ. St. Paul's writings make up the bulk of the New Testament and have served as the foundation for many Church doctrines. St. Peter is seen as the spiritual successor of Jesus by many Christians.

Holy Days

Nativity of St. John the Baptist : On June 24th, we commemorate the birth of St. John the Baptist, a prophet whose life has been seen as a preparation for the coming of Jesus, the Messiah.
