Bishop Peter Fenty

Bishop Peter DeC. Fenty is the area bishop of the episcopal area of York-Simcoe.

He was born in 1951 in Barbados and was ordained a priest there in 1975. He was the rector of three parishes in Barbados. In 1992, he accepted an invitation to become the rector of St. Lawrence church in the Diocese of Montreal. In 1997, he became the incumbent of St. Joseph of Nazareth in Brampton in the Diocese of Toronto.

In 2004, he became the archdeacon of York and the executive officer to the Bishop of Toronto. He was elected bishop on April 6, 2013, and was consecrated area bishop on June 22, 2013.

The York-Simcoe episcopal area

The York-Simcoe episcopal area consists of 47 parishes – 28 single-point and 19 multi-point – with a total of 74 congregations. The area is located in the northwest part of the Diocese, taking in York Region and Simcoe County. There are 57 active clergy, including three deacons and 45 retired clergy. There are several chaplains, including four hospital chaplains, one mental health chaplain, chaplains for Canadian Forces Base Borden, a summer provincial park chaplain, and a Newmarket court chaplain.

Your Life, Your Community, No Place for Drugs

Established by the United Nations, June 26th, 2013 is the International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking. Drug abuse and illicit trafficking continue to have a profoundly negative impact on development and stability across the world. Too many Barbadians at home and abroad are trapped into taking drugs of abuse. Commonly used at all ages and strata of society is marijuana despite it being illegal. However there are many other persons who are addicted to cocaine, heroin and other illegal drugs.

We as the church must play an effective role in offering the youth and society options rather the use of drugs. By setting good examples to others, and having programmes at the Church of Christ the King would also strengthen our youth, keep them focused and away from the temptations of society. Positive peer pressure by associating with progressive persons may also assist in preventing this possible start to addiction. By working together we can create a healthier and safer world free from addiction to drugs and crime which tends to result therefrom.

Drug use is not child's play. It is dangerous to the health of the abuser. Good health should become the new high in one's life, not drugs. Young people often talk about the "highs" induced by illicit drugs but may not be aware of the many "lows". Illicit drug use is a serious concern because it poses a threat to health. Many persons end up in the Psychiatric Hospital, QEH, many clinics and drug rehab centres across Barbados.

The negative effects drug use vary depending on the type of drug consumed, the doses taken and the frequency of use. It must be noted that all drugs of abuse have immediate physical effects that can also severely hinder psychological and emotional development. For example, a marijuana cigarette contains much more tar than a normal cigarette, which increases users' risk of getting lung cancer and other respiratory diseases. People who snort cocaine risk damage the fragile tissue in their noses. Injecting drugs can expose users to various infectious diseases, including HIV/AIDS. And drug use in general can lead to a number of health problems, such as malnutrition, apathy, menstrual irregularities and irregular heart rhythm.

Leading a healthy lifestyle requires making choices that are respectful of body and mind. To make healthy choices, people - particularly the young - need guidance from role models and need to get the right facts about drug use.
