

# Saints' Days

**Ignatius of Loyola:** Ignatius lived 1491 to 1556 and was a Spanish knight, hermit priest and theologian. He founded the Society of Jesus - the Jesuits and was their first Superior General. As the leader of the Jesuits, he emerged as a religious leader during the Counter-Reformation. He is commemorated on the date of his death - July 31<sup>st</sup>.

Joseph of Arimathaea: Joseph of Arimathaea will forever be linked with the Passion of Christ. For it is from his donated tomb that Christ was resurrected. Many Christian interpret his role as fulfilling Isaiah's prophecy that the grave of the "Suffering Servant" would be with the rich - Isaiah 53:9. Joseph of Arimathaea is commemorated on August 1<sup>st</sup>.

- April 14: Anniversary of the Slave Rebellion led by the Right Excellent Bussa
- April 28: National Heroes Day
- July 26: The Day of National Significance which commemorates the 1937 Riots
- August 1: Emancipation Day
- August 23: The International Day for the Remembrance of the Slave Trade and its Abolition.
