

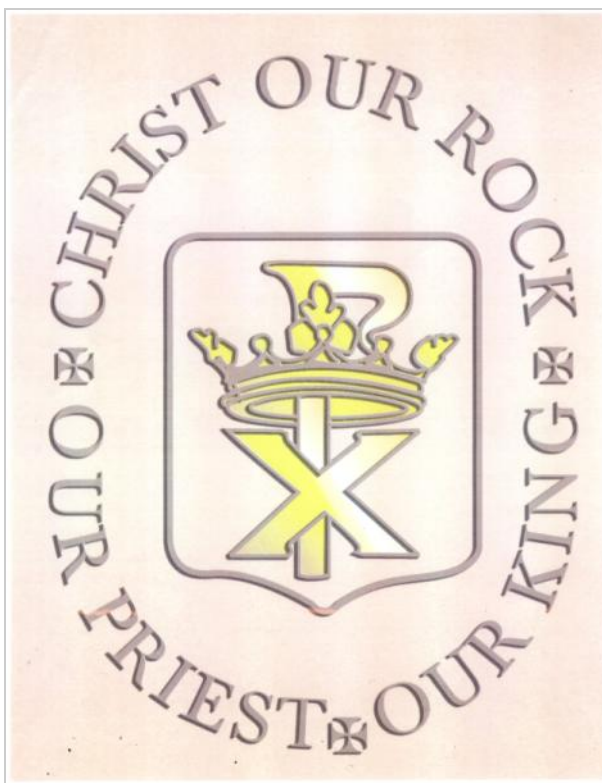

SERMON NOTES

Saints' Days

St. Clement: According to tradition, Clement was consecrated by Peter the Apostle and was the 2nd or 3rd Bishop of Rome. His only genuine existing work is his letter to the church at Corinth. From this document, we derive our concept of Apostolic Succession and a standard by which a doctrine is tested for validity. St. Clement is commemorated on November 23rd.
