

Trinity Sunday

The first Sunday after the Day of Pentecost is the Feast of the Holy Trinity. On this day, the Church rejoices in the most fundamental of Christian beliefs that God is three-in-one. How this is done is completely beyond the ability of any human to understand and it is only by the power of the Holy Spirit that Christians accept this incomprehensible mystery as a fundamental article of faith.

Corpus Christi

Celebrated on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday, this feast commemorates the tradition and belief in the body and blood of Jesus Christ and His Real Presence in the Fucharist.

The Visit of the Blessed Virgin Mary to Elizabeth

The Visitation was recorded in the Gospel of Luke 1: 39-56 and is commemorated on May 31st in the Anglican church. St. Luke tells us that during this visit Mary, echoing Hannah in the Samuel story, spoke the words of praise to God for what he had done. These words would later become known as the Magnificat. The collect for this day can be found on page 185 in the Book of Common Prayer.
