1st Lesson: Genesis 18: 1-10

Eucharistic Minister

READER: A reading from the word of God, written in Genesis Chapter 18 beginning to read at the 1st verse.

The LORD appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. He looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them, and bowed down to the ground. He said, "My lord, if I find favor with you, do not pass by your servant. Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree. 2nd Lesson: Colossians 1:15-28

READER: A reading from the word of God, written in Colossians Chapter 1, beginning to read at the 15thverse.

He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers--all things have been created through him and for him. He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross. And you who were once estranged and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, he has now reconciled in his fleshly body through death, so as to present you holy and blameless and irreproachable before him--provided that you continue securely established and steadfast in the faith, without shifting from the hope promised by the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven. I, Paul, became a servant of this gospel. I am now rejoicing in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am completing what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church. I became its servant according to God's commission that was given to me for you, to make the word of God fully known, the mystery that has been hidden throughout the ages and generations but has now been revealed to his saints. To them God chose to make known how great among the Gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. It is he whom we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone in all wisdom, so that we may present everyone mature in Christ.

Saints' Days

St. Mary Magdalene

As one of the important early Disciples of Christ, Mary Magdalene was the first person to see the risen Christ. She has been called the second most important woman in the New Testament after Mary, the mother of Jesus. This year, the feast of St. Mary Magdalene is commemorated on July 22nd.

St. James the Apostle

James was one of the first apostles of Jesus and one of the three Apostles to witness the Transfiguration. Tradition holds that he was martyred by King Herod. The feast of St. James the Apostle is celebrated on July 25th.

St. Christopher

Known as the "Christ bearer", St. Christopher is the patron saint of travellers. Historians believe that he may have been martyred in the 3rd century under Emperor Decius or Dacian. St. Christopher is remembered on July 25th.

Joachim and Anne, Parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Neither St. Anne nor St. Joachim is mentioned in the New Testament writing, and all we know about them is found in apocryphal writings. They are commemorated together on July 26th.

The Eucharist

The Eucharist is one of the most widely used forms of worship among Christians throughout the world. It is a commemoration of the Last Supper as recorded in the Gospels. It is both described as a sacrament and a sacrifice and the catechism in our Book of Common Prayer defines both of these.
