"Whoever is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much; and whoever is dishonest in a very little is dishonest also in much. If then you have not been faithful with the dishonest wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? And if you have not been faithful with what belongs to another, who will give you what is your own? No slave can serve two masters; for a slave will either hate the one and love the other, or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth."

Saints' Days

Sergius, Abbot: To the Russian people, Sergius is a national hero and their patron saint. At the age of 20, he and his brother began a life of seclusion from which developed the Monastery of the Holy Trinity, a centre of revival of Russian Christianity. Sergius' firm support of Prince Dmitri Donskoi helped rally the Russians and laid the foundation of his people's independent national life. The Church observes Sergius' memory on September 25^{th} .

Lancelot Andrewes, Bishop: Lancelot was an English bishop and scholar who held high positions in the Church of England during the reigns of Queen Elizabeth I and King James I. He oversaw the translation of what has now become known as the King James Version of the Bible. As a scholar, Lancelot continues to influence religious thinkers to the present day and was even cited as an influence by T.S. Eliot. The life of Lancelot Andrewes is commemorated on September 26^{th} .
