Holy Days

The Epiphany of our Lord

For Western Christians, this is the feast day that celebrates the revelation of the glory of God to the Gentiles. This is portrayed in the visitation of the Magi to the baby Jesus. This day is also known as Theophany and it is celebrated on January 6th.

Thoughts on Epiphany

The feast of Epiphany is preceded in importance by only three other feasts during the liturgical year. With the presentation of the gifts by the Magi, we recall the entire Paschal Mystery and the connection between the Incarnation and the Resurrection.

It calls us to contemplate our own creation and its orientation towards Christ. While we may first be drawn to the three gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, the true gift of Epiphany is Christ's gift of himself for our salvation.

Thus, the gifts presented by the Magi should be representations of our own gifts to the Lord.
